#### Dr. Bernadette Kelley-Brown, Principal Investigator Summary Report 2020-2021

This funding year (2020-2021) has been phenomenal despite the challenges of the COVID-19 worldwide pandemic, late starting date due to delay in receiving funds (October 2020), difficulty in employing office assistance, and the move to meetings having to be held virtually. This past year's experiences have provided other opportunities to expand the mission of the Commissioner of Education's African American History Task Force.

This past year the AAHTF has provided a response to the legislative mandate (HB 1213) to begin to formulate and design lessons for the teaching of the Ocoee Massacre.

#### Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. The Commissioner of Education's African American History Task Force is directed to examine ways in which the history of the 1920 Ocoee Election Day Riots will be included in instruction on African American history required pursuant to s. 1003.42(2)(h), Florida Statutes.

The task force shall submit its recommendations to the Commissioner of Education and the State Board of Education by March 1, 2021.

Several additional school districts (11) engaged the AAHTF to begin seeking the "Exemplary" status in the teaching of African and African American History content by adopting and implementing the criteria established by the Task force:

- 1. SCHOOL BOARD APPROVAL OF THE AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY INITIATIVE
- 2. STRUCTURED PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT
- 3. AFRICAN AMERICAN STUDIES CURRICULUM
- 4. STRUCTURED TEACHING OF THE AFRICAN AMERICAN
- 5. UNIVERSITY SCHOOL DISTRICT COLLABORATION
- 6. PARENT/COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

As a result of the district's efforts to implement the criteria Alachua County Public Schools was awarded the distinction of being an Exemplary District. Duval County Public Schools, Miami Dade Public Schools, Broward County Public Schools, and Palm Beach Public Schools renewed their commitment to being Exemplary for another 5 years.

During this year's funding cycle, the AAHTF with consultants revised the "Instructional Standards" guide which will provide links to Florida's standards as educators infuse the African and African American history and accomplishments into their instruction. The Task Force also worked with a consultant to develop a short video guide to describe the FS Statue 1003.42(2)(h) which is placed on the AAHTF website. There were many of successes throughout the State of Florida that emphasized the teaching and learning of African American History and Contributions.

Finally, despite the unusual instructional year, the AAHTF held its annual "Summer Institute' June 15-16, 2021, where over 600 educators and other stakeholders attended and were enthusiastically engaged.

The African American History Task Force is excited about the possibilities for the upcoming 2021-2022 to enhance the education of all of Florida's students, educators, parents, and community partners in the contributions and rich history of African Americans.
